In a lecture earlier this year, historian Frances Stonor Saunders encouraged listeners to think not only about *who* they are, but *where* they are, saying: "We construct borders to fortify our sense of who we are; and we cross them in search of who we might become. They are philosophies of space, credibility contests, latitudes of neurosis, signatures to the social contract, soothing containments, scars." Our borders and boundaries may be physical barriers, but they also move beyond that. Our physical spaces dictate who and what we become; and our beliefs influence the physical spaces that we occupy.

In our scholarship, our teaching, and our writing, we consider these borders, boundaries, and beliefs continuously: How does our work reinforce, challenge, or transgress these ideas? How are our beliefs related to the borders and boundaries we identify for ourselves? What is the role of our work in the public conversations surrounding these topics?

The 14th Annual MEGAA Symposium invites proposals for papers and panels by graduate students from all disciplines that investigate *borders*, *boundaries*, *and beliefs*. Submissions might include traditional academic presentations, fiction, nonfiction, poetry, hybrid forms, and panels. We are open to pushing the boundaries of the traditional academic conference.

- Boundary-crossing collaborations
- Boundaries of gender & sexuality
